Book Report Project

All projects are due on the first day of school.

1. Choose a new book (may not be a book you're already reading or have previously read).
2. Read the entire book
3. Create a book jacket for the book that you read. This must include a front cover for your book (different for the real cover) and a summary of your book on the back cover. You may use construction paper or computer paper for your front/back covers. Your summary must be a least 7 sentences. Your sentences must be neat, with proper spelling and punctuation.

Summary is 5 sentences and has a beginning, middle, and end. There are some missing details from the story, but the main ideas are present. Little to no spelling or grammar errors.	Summary is not the required length, but the main idea of the story is present. A few spelling and grammar mistakes.	Summary is not the required length, nor is it evident that the student has completed reading the book. The summary includes a number of spelling and grammar errors.
